Prior recurring instruction – "Impaired Driving Enforcement" (Various locations): I have hosted and instructed courses related to impaired driving enforcement throughout the States of Colorado and Wyoming. I have trained and certified approximately 200 people in Standardized Field Sobriety Testing, DUI Detection, and Evidential Breath Alcohol Testing – including law enforcement, attorneys, and military personnel with curriculum provided by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration on DUI Detection and enforcement, and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

Additionally, I hosted and instructed Colorado's first "green lab" at the Windsor Police Department incorporating marijuana impairment detection with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration curriculum for traditional impaired driving enforcement.
